1. Management Oversight:

• A robust system of policies and procedures will be in place to promote the licensing objectives. Staff training will be regularly conducted in line with the City Corporation's expectations (Policy, Section 5.37, 5.40(d)).

• A comprehensive incident log will be maintained to record any incidents relating to crime, disorder, or nuisance (Policy, Section 6.55).

2. Risk Assessments:

• Risk assessments will be conducted periodically, considering crime prevention, public safety, and noise management (Policy, Section 5.40(f), Section 6.60(a)).

3. Engagement with Authorities:

• Regular collaboration with local authorities, police, and environmental health to address emerging issues and ensure compliance (Policy, Section 6.56, Section 7.70)

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

1. CCTV System:

• A high-quality CCTV system will cover internal and external areas, with recordings stored for at least 31 days and made available to authorities upon request (Policy, Section 6.57(b)).

• Signage will be prominently displayed to inform patrons of CCTV use.

2. Staff Training:

• Staff will receive training on the responsible sale of alcohol, identifying intoxicated individuals, and conflict resolution (Policy, Section 5.37).

• Specific training will address proxy purchasing and the Challenge 25 scheme (Policy, Section 9.111).

3. Alcohol Sales Policy:

• Alcohol sales will follow the Challenge 25 scheme, requiring valid photo ID for verification (Policy, Section 9.111(a)).

• Alcohol displays will be monitored via CCTV to reduce theft risks and ensure compliance with age verification policies. 4. Crime Deterrence:

• Alcohol stock displayed overnight will be limited to deter opportunistic theft (Policy, Section 6.57(c)).

• Collaborate with local police to identify and mitigate crime trends in the area (Policy, Section 6.56).

c) Public safety

1. Health and Safety Compliance:

• Fire safety checks will be conducted regularly, and emergency exits will be well-marked and unobstructed (Policy, Section 7.70(ii)).

• The premises' capacity will comply with fire risk assessments and Health and Safety at Work requirements (Policy, Section 7.83).

2. Counter-Terrorism Measures:

• Staff will complete Action Counters Terrorism (ACT) e-learning training, as recommended by the City Corporation (Policy, Section 7.75).

• Periodic security reviews will assess and mitigate vulnerabilities, considering advice from Counter-Terrorism Security Advisors (Policy, Section 7.73).

3. Vulnerability Safeguards:

• Policies like the "Ask for Angela" initiative will protect vulnerable customers (Policy, Section 7.77).

• Staff will be trained to address situations involving vulnerability, including sexual harassment, domestic abuse, or child exploitation (Policy, Section 7.76).

d) The prevention of public nuisance

1. Noise Management:

• Noise levels will be regularly monitored, and doors/windows kept closed to prevent noise breakout (Policy, Section 8.93 (i)).

• Deliveries and waste collections will occur during reasonable hours to minimise disruption (Policy, Section 8.89).

2. Customer Dispersal:

Notices will be displayed requesting customers leave quietly and avoid disturbing neighbours (Policy, Section 8.97(a)).
 Staff will assist with orderly dispersal, including arranging taxis for late-night patrons (Policy, Section 8.97(h)).

3. Waste Management:

• Regular cleaning of external areas and provision of bins to manage litter and prevent nuisance (Policy, Section 8.101)

e) The protection of children from harm

1. Age Verification Policy:

• A robust Challenge 25 policy will be implemented, requiring valid photo ID such as a passport, driving licence, or PASS card (Policy, Section 9.111(a)).

• Staff will receive specific training on age verification and proxy purchasing prevention (Policy, Section 9.111(b)).

2. Safeguarding Policy:

• Staff will be trained to identify and report child safeguarding concerns, following Government guidance on protecting children from harm (Policy, Section 9.109).

• A refusals log will be maintained for all declined alcohol sales due to age concerns (Policy, Section 9.111(e)).

3. CCTV Monitoring:

• CCTV will monitor areas near alcohol displays to prevent underage theft or proxy purchasing (Policy, Section 9.111(d)).

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
