


How to pay for Adult Social Care

In order to calculate how much you will need to contribute, you will need to have a Financial Assessment.

Financial Assessment

The Assessment will determine whether you will need to contribute towards your care costs. To request an assessment get in touch with the Adult Social Care Team by calling 0207 332 1224 or email Adults.Duty@cityoflondon.gov.uk

You will not have to pay for:

- re-ablement support (for up to six weeks)
- minor aids and adaptions
- care and support provided to people with Cruetzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD)
- aftercare/support provided under section
 117 under the Mental Health Act 1983
- NHS services including Continuing Healthcare (CHC)

What you may have to pay for

Following your Financial Assessment, you may have to contribute towards the following:

- Care and support with a disability or health condition
- Care at home or in your community including a carer visiting you or for meals at a day centre
- Residential or nursing care homes
- Telecare services

Ways to pay

When you arrange a Financial Assessment the ways to contribute to your care and support will be explained to you.

They are:

- Direct Payments
- Deferred Payment Arrangement (DPA)
- Personal Budget
- Deferring the cost of your home (for residential and nursing care homes)
