LBL is supportive of the approach to sustainable design in the City Plan 2040, as set out under Strategic Policy S8: Design and Policy DE1: Sustainable Design.

In particular, the approach to *Retrofit First* (Policy DE1 (1) and S8 (1)) across these policies is commended. Together, the policies provide a pragmatic approach to ensuring that the retention and retrofit of existing buildings is the starting point for new development, while allowing redevelopment where this would represent the most sustainable or suitable option for a site.

LBL consider this represents a sound and justified approach to meeting the City Plan's sustainability objectives, namely supporting climate mitigation and resilience, environmental protections, and waste management, and will play an important role in the City of London meeting its Net Zero pledge.

LBL supports the requirement for carbon reporting on all major developments, as set out under Policy DE1 (2). This will ensure a standardised approach is taken when considering the different carbon options for a development proposals, and represents an effective and transparent means for considering the appropriateness of retrofit against redevelopment.

LBL also supports the requirement for whole life-cycle carbon assessments for all major development, as set out under Policy DE1 (3). Whole-life carbon assessments are an effective mechanism for understanding the total carbon emissions of a building over its life time, and have been tried and tested through London Plan Policy SI2 for applications referrable to the Mayor for a number of years. The approach is justified given the objectives of the City Plan set out above.

Lambeth considers the aforementioned policies to be sound and consistent with national policy, namely NPPF para 157 and 159. These policies would also support the statutory requirement under Section 19(1A) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 which requires local planning authorities to include in their Local Plans "policies designed to secure that the development and use of land in the local planning authority's area contribute to the mitigation of, and adaptation to, climate change".

LBL considers *Strategic Policy S13: Protected Views* to be sound, following the amendments made since the Reg 19 City Plan 2036 was published for consultation.

LBL is supportive of the addition of criterion 4 of Policy S13 which states that the City Corporation will have "regard to views of the City that have been designated by other Local Planning Authorities".

This additional text reflects the suggestions made by LBL in its representation made in May 2021 to the Reg 19 consultation to the Corporation's City Plan 2036.

The nature of local views designations in Lambeth and adjoining boroughs means that many views cross borough boundaries. This means that cooperation between boroughs is particularly important if views are to be managed effectively. LBL considers Policy S13 provides an effective and justified approach to protecting and enhancing views of the City's skyline.

As a result of these changes, Lambeth considers the plan to be sound, with no further concerns outstanding.

The CoL has taken a positive approach to plan making, having regard to the LBL representations. CoL has also maintained regular correspondence with their counterparts at Lambeth. Officers have met on various occasions under the duty to cooperate to discuss the preparation of development plan documents and consider any strategic and cross border issues.

Further detail of how the parties have worked together under the Duty to Cooperate are documented within a joint Statement of Common Ground between the two parties which will be published in document library.
