LB Hackney response to City of London City Plan 2040 (Regulation 19)

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Regulation 19 version of City of London's City Plan 2040. Hackney is supportive of the overall vision for the City and the Strategic Objectives contained with the document. I can confirm that we do not have any objections relating to soundness or legal compliance matters.

You will be aware from our regular engagement that Hackney is preparing an Area Action Plan for Shoreditch, which lies adjacent to the City boundary, and updating evidence to support a forthcoming review of its Local Plan. In this regard, it would be helpful to continue discussions on the cross boundary impacts of the proposed employment policies on Shoreditch and the wider Hackney area. We are keen to understand if the proposed 1.2 million square metres of additional office space is a demand based figure and how you are proposing to meet this over the plan period.

The general principle of enhancing Liverpool Street station and the surrounding area is supported. The Council will continue to monitor this aspect and provide further comments as detailed proposals emerge.
