Under the requirements of the Flood and Water Management Act 2010 The Corporation of London must develop, maintain, apply and monitor a strategy for local flood risk management in its area. The Draft Local Flood Risk Management Strategy 2014-2020 (LRMS) contains policies that will manage local flood risk from surface water, groundwater and ordinary watercourses. The purpose of the LRMS is to outline the City Corporation's approach to this role and to local flood risk management in the City.

The strategy forms a policy document which sets out an action plan for implementation measures over 2014-2020 and is supported by a number of annexes detailing the policies operational requirements contained within the Act.

Safety issues for different population groups in terms of flood risk are dealt with by the City Corporation's Security and Contingency unit.

Once implemented, the strategy will have a positive contribution in terms of protecting those at greatest risk priority in terms of flood risk.
